#### **Workstream Members**

##### **Remuneration**

- None.

##### **Nominal term (subject to continuation of funding)**

- The nominal term of membership is for 3 years, with potential to reapply for a further 2 years.
- Members who have come to the end of their 3+2 years may reapply for an extension of a further 2 years for consideration by the review panel, for example where they are heavily involved in ongoing projects with CTRad or where they have specialist expertise that is underrepresented on the group. However, precedence will be given to new applications that meet the requirements for CTRad membership.

##### **Activities**

- Members will be expected to actively contribute to defining and delivering the objectives of the workstream.

##### **Criteria for selection**

- Members will be expected to:
  - be established, successful researchers in their field
  - have relevant national and international links
  - show enthusiasm and commitment to developing inclusive, UK-wide approaches to radiotherapy and associated radiobiology research.
- Membership of the workstreams will be multidisciplinary, ensuring that all scientific/medical disciplines are able to contribute.
- There will be a focus on including less experienced members who show the potential to become leaders in the field in the future, while continuing to include some highly experienced researchers with strong track records.

##### **Selection process**

- Workstream members are recruited by competitive application from those working in a relevant field in the UK.
  - Advertisements will be made publicly available using relevant channels.
  - Applications will involve a CV and letter of experience/motivation.
  - Applications will be reviewed by the Executive Group Chair/Deputy Chair, workstream co-chairs and the NCRI Secretariat, and a decision made at a review panel teleconference.
