## Current vacancies: Workstream 1 and 4 co-chair positions

### Do you want to help shape radiotherapy research in the UK?

The National Cancer Research Institute (NCRI) Clinical and Translational Radiotherapy Research Working Group (CTRAd) is an NCRI initiative setup in 2009 to focus on clinical and translational issues relating to radiotherapy and radiobiology, as well as developing a portfolio of practice-changing trials. We are currently seeking Co-chair applications for two of CTRAd's four Workstreams, effective from October 2018:

**Workstream 1 (Science Base): clinical oncology co-chair**

**Workstream 4 (New technology, physics, quality assurance): scientific/technical co-chair**

The positions have a nominal term of three years (subject to continuation of the initiative beyond its current funding period up to March 2021). The new Co-chairs will contribute to the leadership of CTRAd as part of the Executive Group, which includes taking forward areas of activity that lie outside the remit of the individual Workstreams (for example, workforce development or training). Workstream Co-chairs are supported by the Executive Group in the planning and delivery of their respective Workstream objectives.
